There are near accidents there everyday! - Recreation guide - mail to homes - most people do not have school age children. - City + school need to work together to offer winter swimming for adults - not a 2 hour window from 3-5pm - people work need hours 4-7 at least. I really love Euclid... we just need to step it up a notch and make it an outstanding City!

Would love to see targeted streets completely reinvented - houses inside + out - to market to couples and singles. Our housing is the right size for the growing demographic; our location is great. Amenities and quality housing are needed. Thoughts on Schools in Euclid: More than retail, more than services, more than new housing, I believe that Euclid Public Schools as a successful innovative system would bring people into Euclid. EPS at one time had a valued reputation for students and parents. However, the majority of students and parents today need far more motivation and assistance than many inner ring suburbs can provide. EPS needs to try an innovative best practices approach to the challenges of today's impoverished, under skilled, and lack of motivated youth. Such students may present behavior issues in the classroom that disrupts the education process for all students. There must be Educational Practices that help ameliorate poor attendance, poor discipline and lack of motivation. Part of the success of any large for public education must include support from everyone: parents, citizens, non-profits, business and local government. It is too big and important job for one agency. Good Schools are instrumental to encouraging families to move to and continue to live in our community. Some ideas that may have already discussed or implemented might be the following type of activities: Support Social Service agencies that are directly involved and residing in the schools as a way to improve parent/student/teacher relationships. Business, the Arts, Sports, Vocational Training, and other helpful services need to be part of the Education process. The Schools contain a "captive" audience in need of such help and outlets. I have seen this type of agency support superficially involved in Public Schools, but have never seen direct involvement. The Door, a non-profit, in NYC had Legal, Medical, Education services housing in one building to serve poor and transient youth in lower Manhattan. It is one model for success. Today's stressed families need more support in order to create and nurture learning, critical thinking and self-sufficiency. Schools cannot be all things to everyone, but they need to be a safe and educationally stimulating environment for all students. It is important to help parents become a partner in the process of educating their child. Outside agencies is one tool to assist educators with this process. City government, if it hopes to grow a city, must foster an environment that grows good schools. Council members, Nonprofits, Businesses, Libraries... all partners in the progress of good citizenship, need to come together frequently to assist in growing a healthy successful public and private schools.

[From typed note inside survey]: To whom it may concern: I moved to Euclid in 2002 when I was 25 years old, I moved to Euclid at that time mostly for convenience as it was centrally located for work, Airport, and downtown. I grew up in the country (east). I was looking for Suburb of Cleveland when I found a decent well-built home for a reasonable price in a quiet neighborhood. Unfortunately, what was about to happen was unforeseen to new residents. In or around 2005 I really started to notice a decline in quality of residents that were moving in. Unfortunately these new home owners couldn't afford their home resulting in a lot of abandoned homes on my street and all around this town and subsequently some became rentals. This has impacted my property value and my neighborhood negatively for several reasons. The homes are selling for 3x's less than what I owe on my home. These residence's do not take care or maintain their home, landscaping or other visual needs, and they are not held accountable. The quality of these renters are a nuisance and they do not follow proper zoning rules or follow laws. Garbage laying around, cars parked on grass or parked in "no parking zones", lawns and leaves not maintained, more drug activity, wrecked cars sitting with flat tires and no license plates just to mention a few items, So what I see here is no consistency with in Euclid's zoning enforcement and what seems to be completely charismatic in our city image. Euclid used to have a slogan "The City of superior services," this has become a joke and I believe they no longer use this slogan. This was easier than fixing their problems and becoming great again, but I guess they can't do that when they don't respect what they already have and take proper care of it. Pot holes in streets, the city is supposed to maintain the various cul-de-sacs, my neighborhood has two of them in the development that are always over grown and not kept. These green spaces should look as beautiful as a park. Speaking of which the Hen mansion and park is also very unkempt, so is our golf course, trash was strewn all over the golf course entrance way on Babbitt road a few weeks back where it laid there for three days? How many times did city workers drive by it and never pick it up? They used to spray for mosquitoes and spray the curbs for weeds, I see no more of these services, but yet they demand that home owners through taxes pay for street lights and garbage. Speaking of garbage, if anything falls out of the can when the truck comes, they don't pick any of it up, it just blows all over the town. It seems as though we get less now and pay more than what we used to. It seems all this past and current administration wants, is to build some kind of boardwalk nonsense. My question is why would you waste money on that? I feel 185th street should be our staple and needs completely revitalized, not just throw your hands up and say oh well and build new. Again, I feel they don't do a good job with what they already have and need to address, before they think about building out. This town does not need any more low income housing or apartments. We need quality. We need quality home owners/renters that want to live here and be a respectable part of the neighborhood, not trouble makers. I've heard mention of the Euclid Square Mall, this too was the start of ruined retail in the early 90s for Euclid. Other Comments:

Our Euclid City streets are in horrible shape. In need of repaving and the water/sewer lines need replacing. We currently pay for trash pick-up and lighting. In addition, to the 2.85% tax on our earnings. Snow removal does not exist but we still pay for it. City workers are not customer service friendly. I see several City workers smoking in City vehicles, which by the way is against the law. Do not approach any of these workers, they are rude and lack customer service skill. That pretty much covers most of the people employed by the City. If one calls the City of Euclid it's not going to be a helpful friendly phone call.

The City lacks owner occupied properties. We need more home owners living in their home. This City has a high number of renters with no enforcement for the renter or the landlord. We cannot have a strong City without the investment of the homeowner. With the large number of rentals in this City there is no investment into the City from renters.

I paid over \$3,500.00 in resident tax for 2015 and receive the same services (which is pretty much none) as the resident that pays half that amount in taxes. I'm not saying I should receive special attention. However, if you do not have services to offer me to support the amount of resident tax I pay, I see no need to live in the City of Euclid. Why not take my tax base elsewhere to receive better services?

The City of Euclid does not support a good school system. Proof of that is the State report card for the district. There again, when levies come up for vote, I will not support an increase in tax base for schools that are not making the grade. It's throwing hard earned money at a problem with no solution for fixing the problem. Tax payers have given the school districts enough time and money to fix the issues with no results.

One of the questions asked about ease of access the lake? As a home owner, I don't see that access. We have a beautiful lake and need to keep it that way.
